PAUL A. BRANELLY

Sportsman, family-man, assurance underwriter — in all these fields Queensland LUA President Paul A. Brannelly is an outstanding producer. In addition, his service to the LUA as Councillor for Legal & General since 1962, as Divisional President since 1968, and as Federal Vice-President (membership) since 1971, has been first-rate.

From his schooldays at St Joseph's Christian Brothers' College in Brisbane, he has been involved in sport, captaining the school cricket and athletics teams in 1953-54 and the Combined Greater Public Schools' cricket team in 1954.

In 1956, Paul won the Queensland open mile and went on to represent his State at the national athletics championship in Melbourne. He was also picked for the Olympic Games training squad the same year.

His present sporting activities include social cricket with the Tattersall's Backseaters Wanderers, golf and jogging.

Married with five children, Paul can often be seen encouraging his boys in their own sporting activities. They also share the excitement of sailing their 12ft Vagabond on the Brisbane River and in Moreton Bay.

Paul's involvement in community affairs with the Fortitude Valley Jaycees, and as chairman of his church's finance committee, indicates the type of personality which so often proves successful in the life assurance industry.

The writing of over \$12-million of new business in 11 years, including basic production exceeding \$2 million for each of the last three years, indicates the degree of application and organisation which this man brings to his work.

Having been top producer in Queensland for L & G in each of the last four years, he is now all-time leading producer for them in Queensland. In each of the years 1969 and 1970 he was the third leading producer for his company in Australia.

He has qualified for MDRT membership for 1970, 1971, 1972 and attended the annual meetings in 1970 and 1971.

Incidentally, if you set your sights on attending the MDRT annual meeting in 1977, you could get there by means of a free passage as a deckhand on Paul's round-the-world sailing venture. What an incentive.
